Surface water permits are not required for impervious surfaces of no more than 250 cumulative square feet on lots with 80 feet or greater of shoreline. All surfaces shall be setback 10 feet from the shoreline except for buffer access not to exceed 4 feet in width.

Sec. 62-3666. General provisions.

The following provisions shall apply to all class I, II and III waters within the county:

- (1) Acceptable uses within the shoreline protection buffer are passive recreation, hunting, fishing, fish and wildlife management, open space and nature trails, and similar uses.
- (2) New seawalls and bulkheads shall be prohibited along the Indian River lagoon system, except along existing canals in residential neighborhoods adjoining class III waters. Applications for permits for any seawall or bulkhead on canals adjoining class III waters shall be submitted in writing to the county office of natural resources management for consideration. All applications must meet all of the following minimum criteria:

Passive Recreation - recreation uses are considered passive where very minimum alteration of vegetation, topography or other native feature is necessary, for the enjoyment of the site amenities. Activities which are considered passive include, but are not limited to, hiking, bicycling, nature observation, camping, picnicking, non-motorized recreation and sports, archaeological or historic preservation.
